



Allergies: Poison Plant Allergies: Poison Ivy, Oak, and Sumac

Poison ivy, poison oak and poison sumac are plants that contain an irritating, oily sap called *urushiol*. Urushiol triggers an allergic reaction when it comes into contact with skin, resulting in an itchy rash, which can appear within hours of exposure or up to several days later. A person can be exposed to urushiol directly or by touching objects -- such as gardening tools, camping equipment and even a pet's fur -- that have come into contact with the sap of one of the poison plants.

Urushiol is found in all parts of these plants, including the leaves, stems and roots, and is even present after the plant has died. Urushiol is absorbed quickly into the skin. It can also be inhaled if the poison plants are burned. The smoke may expose not only the skin to the chemical but also the nasal passages, throat and lungs. Inhaled urushiol can cause a very serious allergic reaction.

The rash that results from the poison plants is a form of allergic contact dermatitis. (Dermatitis is swelling and irritation of the skin.) Skin is not automatically sensitive to urushiol. Sensitivity builds up after the skin is exposed to the substance. When initially exposed to urushiol, the skin alerts the immune system of the presence of the irritating chemical. (Usually, no visible reaction will occur the first time a person comes in contact with a poison plant.) The immune system then prepares a defensive reaction for the

next time the skin encounters the substance. This sensitizes the skin so that new contact with urushiol causes an allergic reaction.

Poison ivy, poison oak and poison sumac can be found in most areas of the U.S., except Alaska, Hawaii, and the deserts of the Southwest. In some areas of the country (East, Midwest and South), poison ivy grows as a vine. In the northern and western U.S., and around the Great Lakes, it grows as a shrub. Each poison ivy leaf has three leaflets.

Poison oak closely resembles poison ivy, although it is usually more shrub-like, and its leaves are shaped somewhat like oak leaves. The undersides of the leaves are always a much lighter green than the surface and are covered with hair. Poison oak is more common in the western U.S.

Poison sumac grows as a woody shrub, with each stem containing 7 to 13 leaves arranged in pairs. Poison sumac can be distinguished from harmless sumac by its drooping clusters of green berries. Harmless sumac has red, upright berry clusters. Poison sumac is more common in wet, swampy areas.

What Are the Symptoms of a Poison Plant Reaction?

All three plants contain the same chemical, urushiol, and cause the same reaction, which generally occurs in the following phases:

*Redness and itching of the skin.

*A rash erupts on the skin, often in a pattern of streaks or patches from where the plant has come into contact with the skin.
*The rash develops into red bumps, called papules, or large, oozing blisters.

How Common Are Poison Plant Allergies?

Poison ivy, poison oak and poison sumac are three of the most common causes of allergic contact dermatitis in North America. Some experts estimate that three out of four people are sensitive to the chemical found in these plants, although the degree of sensitivity varies. Some people are very sensitive and will have a quick reaction upon contact with a small amount of urushiol. For those who are less sensitive, exposure to a large amount of urushiol is necessary before a reaction develops. Cases of poison plant allergy occur most frequently during the spring, summer, and early fall when people spend more time outdoors.

How Are Reactions to Poison Plants Diagnosed?

An allergic reaction to a poison plant is diagnosed based on the typical

pattern of symptoms and the appearance of the rash.

How Are Reactions to Poison Plants Treated?

An allergic reaction to a poison plant cannot be cured, but the symptoms can be treated. You may take cool showers and apply an over-the-counter lotion -- such as calamine lotion -- to help relieve the itch. If your reaction is more severe or involves mucus membranes (membranes found in the eyes, nose, mouth, and genitals), you may need a prescription medication, such as prednisone, to help control the reaction.

How Long Does a Poison Plant Rash Last?

Most rashes caused by poison ivy, poison oak, or poison sumac are mild and last from 5 to 12 days. In severe cases, the rash can last for 30 days or longer.

Does Immunotherapy Help With Poison Plant Allergies? Immunotherapy is not available for allergies to poison ivy, poison oak and poison sumac.

How Can Poison Plant Reactions Be Prevented?

You can take steps to prevent exposure.

- *Learn to identify poison ivy, poison oak and poison sumac, and avoid contact with them.
- *Remove these plants from around your home, especially in areas where you may be working or playing.
- *When walking in the woods or working in areas where these plants may grow, cover your skin as much as possible by wearing long pants, long-sleeves, shoes and socks.
- *Do not let pets run in wooded areas where they may be exposed to the poison plants. They can carry urushiol back home on their fur.

Is a Poison Plant Rash Contagious?

Many people think a poison plant rash can be spread from one part of the body to another or from person to person. In general, this is not true. You can spread the rash only if you have urushiol on your hands. Also, it can take longer for the rash to appear on certain areas of the body, especially areas such as the soles of the feet where the skin is thicker. This may give the appearance that the rash has spread from one part of the body to another. You can also be re-exposed to the urushiol by touching gardening tools, sports equipment, or other items that were not cleaned after being in contact with the plants. Scratching or touching the rash and fluid from blisters will not cause the rash to spread because urushiol is not present in the blister fluid. What Should I Do If I am Exposed to a Poison Plant?

What Should I Do If I am Exposed to a Poison Plant?

If you think you may have been exposed to a poison plant:

*Remove your clothes.

*Wash all exposed areas with cool running water. Use soap and water if you can. Be sure to clean under your fingernails. In the woods, the water of a running stream can be an effective cleanser. *Wash your clothing and all gardening tools, camping gear, sports equipment and other objects that came into contact with the plants.

*Bathe pets exposed to the plants.

When Should I Call the Doctor?

If any of the following occurs, seek immediate medical attention:

- *You have symptoms of a severe reaction, such as severe swelling and/or difficulty breathing.
- *You have been exposed to the smoke of burning poison ivy, poison oak or poison sumac.
- *The rash covers more than one quarter of your body.
- *The rash occurs on your face, lips, eyes or genitals.
- *The initial treatment does not relieve the symptoms.
- *You develop a fever and/or the rash shows signs of infection, such as increased tenderness, pus or yellow fluid oozing from the blisters, and an odor coming from the blisters.

OMBUDSMAN VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

WHAT IS AN OMBUDSMAN?

An Ombudsman is a person who visits with residents living in long-term care facilities and informs them of their rights. Ombudsman Volunteers are available to residents and their families. Volunteers listen to the residents' concerns they may experience with staff, family or other agencies associated with their care in the facility. They do informal problem solving and support residents and families in solving their own problems. An Ombudsman helps to improve the quality of life and the quality of care available for the residents.

The volunteers in this area are very committed to the program and the residents they serve. Several of the Ombudsman Volunteers in the area have been with the program for many years. The volunteers say the residents count on them coming and look forward to their weekly visits. To become a volunteer in the Ombudsman Program, the applicant must have a concern about older people; be able to work with many types of personalities without being judgmental; be responsible; be willing to follow problems through to their resolution; be able to accept training and supervision; be able to spend at least two hours per week in the program; and be free from conflicts of interest.

Volunteers must also attend a two-day training provided by the Ombudsman Supervisors. Evening and weekend trainings are available upon request. The next training will be held:







Chicken Salad:

1 (10-ounce) boneless skinless chicken breast Salt and freshly ground black pepper Olive oil

1/2 cup mayonnaise plus 2 tablespoons

2 tablespoons black truffle peelings, chopped

1 tablespoon white truffle oil

6 slices sourdough bread

4 Boston Bibb lettuce (yellow inner leaves only)

4 vine ripened tomato slices

6 applewood smoked bacon slices cooked

1/2 avocado peeled and sliced

1/4 pint bean sprouts

French fries or potato chips, as an accompaniment

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Preheat a grill pan. Chicken Salad: Season both sides of the chicken breast with salt, pepper, and a little oil. Place on the grill for approximately 2 1/2 minutes on each side, remove from the grill and place in the oven to finish the cooking process. When the chicken is fully cooked, approximately 12 minutes, place in the refrigerator to cool. After the chicken has cooled, dice it in small bite size pieces and place in a stainless steel bowl with the 1/2 cup mayonnaise, chopped truffle, and truffle oil. Mix well and reserve for later use.

Spread a small amount of mayonnaise onto 2 slices of the sour dough bread. On 1 of the slices with mayonnaise place the following items; Boston lettuce, 2 slices of tomato, 3 slices cooked bacon, 3 slices avocado, and half of the bean

sprouts, place the other slice of bread on top mayonnaise side down. Next place half of the reserved chicken salad on top of the dry side of bread and spread evenly, finish the sandwich with the last slice of dry bread and place in a panini press until toasted. Remove the sandwich from the press and cut in quarters. Repeat with remaining bread and fillings. Serve with French fries or potato chips.





Hayley Knife Chief Receives National High School Player of the Year Award

Hayley Knife Chief (Claremore basketball player) captured the attention of coaches while nabbing a national high school player of the year award during the Native Elite Sports Basketball camp in Macy, Neb., last weekend.

"I didn't expect it because there's a lot of competition," Knife Chief said. "I was shocked, but pleased and honored that I got that award."

The 18-year-old Knife Chief of Claremore, Okla., was among a select group of American Indian boys and girls high school basketball players invited to participate in the annual NES camp, which allowed top athletes from across the United States to show their skills in a gymnasium on the Omaha Reservation.

The July 27-28 camp entered its second year, during which organizers have quickly moved to become NCAA-certified. This year, about 10 coaches from Division I and II colleges attended and scouted for players.

The NES sports showcase is one of the few Indian venues to provide such an opportunity specifically for urban and reservation youths. And young people arrived pumped and ready to play.

"I would put these Native kids against any all-star team in the country," said Barry Webster, chairman of Native Elite Sports, a nonprofit organization dedicated to empowering youth through sports.

All student-athletes were assigned to one of four teams. Each team then competed against one another in a series of three games. Coaches observed. Some offered playing opportunities.

"We exceeded our expectations," Webster said. "We got some Division I schools there. The talent was tremendous. The boys' side was top-notch. It was a great event. Every time you turned around, there was a slam dunk."

Brady Fairbanks of Cass Lake , Minn. , received the boys' title of National High School Player of the Year. And even though he grabbed the attention of on-scene coaches, he already has agreed to play Division II ball at Bemidji State University in Minnesota .

"They're bringing in a lot of good freshmen, and I was one of their top priorities," said Fairbanks, who was a leading scorer and rebounder in Minnesota 's Class 1A high school basketball.

Fairbanks was among the youth asked to participate based on outstanding court skills and a noteworthy academic record

Knife Chief left the camp with one scholarship offer to play ball for Brown Mackie College in Kansas . She said she was thrilled with the offer but still wanted to take her chances back home. She will walk onto the University of Oklahoma 's women's team this fall.


"I want to go to an Oklahoma school and be near my family," said the former all-state player.

The young woman praised the event. "I think NES is going to become something big. It will give a lot of Native Americans a chance to play basketball. I'm very proud of what Barry's done."

Said Webster: "We hope that every Native American boy and girl on every reservation hears about this and is inspired and determined to come to NES and take their game to the next level."



INVENTIONS

History of BASIC

BASIC (standing for Beginner's All Purpose Symbolic Instruction Code) was written (invented) in 1963, at Dartmouth College, by mathematicians John George Kemeny and Tom Kurtzas as a teaching tool for undergraduates. BASIC has been one of the most commonly used computer programming languages, a simple computer language considered an easy step for students to learn before more powerful languages such as FORTRAN. BASIC's popularity was spread by both Paul Allen and William Gates, in 1975. Gates and Allen (both Microsoft founding fathers) wrote a version of BASIC for the Altair personal computer. It was the first product Miscrosoft sold. Later Gates and Microsoft wrote versions for BASIC for the Apple computer, and IBM's DOS which Gates provided came with its' version for BASIC.


