National American Eagle Day – June 20, 2019



Celebrate the United States' national symbol on National American Eagle Day! On June 20, we set aside time to raise awareness about the bald eagle and to preserve the bird's natural habitat. The holiday is meant to educate others about the birds' importance, and to explore ways we can ensure that the eagles continue to thrive for decades to come. In the 1950s, the bald eagle was at serious risk of becoming extinct. Loss of their natural habitat, hunting, and the use of pesticides that damaged their eggs made caused the population to massively decline. The bird was classified as endangered in the U.S. in 1967. The bird went on to become a prime success story of the Endangered Species Act. The bald eagle began to repopulate and thrive, and in 1995, it was moved from the national endangered species list to the national list of threatened spe-

cies—a major improvement! As of 2007, the bald eagle is no longer considered threatened and has a healthy population level. National American Eagle Day was launched by the American Eagle Foundation, a Tennessee organization focused on protecting bald eagles and their fellow birds of prey. Bald eagles like to live near large bodies of water, as they mostly eat fish, and are known for their beauty and grace when they soar through the air. They have been known as treasured symbols of the United States since the 1700s.

How to Observe National American Eagle Day

Watch the D.C. Eagle Cam The D.C. Eagle Cam is a live stream that allows anyone in the world to

take a peak into the lives of two bald eagles living in the U.S. National Arboretum in Washington, D.C. A video camera fixed on the eagles' nest offers snapshots of their lives.

Visit the zoo

If your local zoo is home to bald eagles, National American Eagle Day is the perfect time to pay a visit and watch them in action. The San Diego Zoo, the National Zoo, an the Saint Louis Zoo all house bald eagles—and there's a good chance that a zoo in your area does the same.

Do some volunteer work for preservation groups

Seek out local preservation groups in your area and offer to lend a hand. Whether you assist a charity that advocates for bald eagles, or an organization that is focused on other species that are still endangered, your help can make a difference! Check out the American Eagle Foundation to get started.

Why National American Eagle Day is Important

They are epic

Most Americans recognize the image of the bald eagle right away, but few of us know much about how the eagles live or what role they play in our natural ecosystem. The American bald eagle is the only eagle unique to North America, and they can be found all over the continent, from Alaska to Northern Mexico. They are also one of the largest birds in North America, with a wingspan of 80 inches, and build massive nests that are 5 to 6 feet in diameter.

They are champions of endangered species

Not too long ago, the future of the bald eagle seemed dire. Thanks to the hard work of conservationists, and the birds' classification as endangered species, anxiety over their extinction is a thing of the past. It's a great reminder that with awareness and determination, we can save endangered species who need protection. Perhaps black rhinos, Bengal tigers, and other endangered species can have similar success stories someday.

They are totally patriotic

The bald eagle was named the National Emblem of the United States in 1782, and its image is used throughout the country as a symbol of this great nation. The image of the bald eagle can be found on gold coins, the silver dollar, the half dollar, and the quarter, plus on the Great Seal of the United States. According to John F. Kennedy, ""The founding fathers made an appropriate choice when they selected the bald eagle as the emblem of the nation. The fierce beauty and proud inde-

pendence of this great bird aptly symbolizes the strength and freedom of America."

Encounter Norma

For young families living in the mountains of Guatemala, raising a baby can be hard. Most families grow corn and beans for a living, but a long-standing drought has caused harvests to shrink. There are few job opportunities, which means putting food on the table is a daily challenge. That's why when Norma discovered she was pregnant, she wondered how she would manage. "When I was young, my mom and dad didn't have money to buy much food," she says. "My mom would split one egg among four children." Norma wanted more for her son, Victor.

But at age 20, she didn't have much experience beyond helping her mother around the house. So, she looked for help. She found it in a CRS-sponsored program that teaches young mothers how to raise healthy children, grow nutritious food in small gardens and manage a healthy diet. Plus, CRS provided Norma with food throughout her pregnancy and monthly medical checkups during Victor's first two years of life.

"I learned a lot of beautiful things," Norma says. "I learned how to take care of my boy and what foods to feed him so that he can grow healthy and strong." Now, Norma is sharing what she learned with others as a "mother monitor." "It makes me proud to share the experience I had and the lessons I learned with other women," she says. It makes Norma proud—and makes her community a better place to raise a family.

Café Owner Hires a Felon to Wash Dishes



When a homeless man walked into Cesia Abigail Baires' restaurant asking for money, she didn't give him the typical response.

She looked at him and said, "Why don't you have a job? You know nothing is given to me for free right?"

He replied, "Well, I have a lot of felonies and no one wants to hire me for that, so now I had to turn myself to the streets and get money the only way I know, stealing and asking for money."

"He told me about his situation. He said he got felonies, and nobody wants to hire him. Especially around this area if you look homeless they won't even let you in," said Baires. "To me that's unacceptable."

Seeing as she was short-staffed that day, Cesia decided she would give the man a shot working as a dishwasher in her Minneapolis cafe. With wide eyes and a big smile, he replied that he'd do anything for some food.

But as badly as this man longed for his next meal, she was stunned when she saw what he did with the food she gave him AND that he wanted to pay her for it.

"He only ate half of it, then one of his lady friends walked by and he wrapped half of his food and ran to the door and gave the food to her," said Baires. "I said, 'Marcus do you know the lady over there?' and he said 'No, but I know that she is hungry so I gave her my food."

After two weeks, he only continued to impress Baires and her staff with his selfless heart. She took to Facebook to share her experience, and it's since accumulated over 127,000 likes and 40,000 shares.


"He has been a blessing for me," Baires told ABC News. "I don't see it as me being a blessing to him. I see it as me being blessed, so I can bless him, so he can bless me."

Wife Sobs in Coffee Drive -Thru After Husband Dies—Then She Sees 3 Words Written on Her Cup



"It's interesting when you're in crisis the subtle things you do to shield people from knowing how bad things really are or how sad you really feel. After all, as the caretaker, you have to be the strong one. You have to hold it together. You have to make sure everybody else is ok."

Those are the words of Diana Register, a heartbroken widow in the throes of grief over the loss of her husband to pancreatic cancer.

Unwanting to drag others down or ignite feelings of pity from friends, family, and strangers alike, Diana often found herself seeking out hiding places to let it all out.

In fact, for her, the grieving process started long before she had to lay her sweet husband in the ground.

She explains that even before her husband's cancer diagnosis, she would search for places to go where people couldn't see the uncontrolled waterfalls from her eyes that silently screamed her pain — the pain of the loss that she had not yet experienced, but soon would.

"During my husband's cancer journey, I found the most interesting places to cry where he, or anybody else wouldn't see me," she wrote to Love What Matters.

"The closet was a favorite. The shower. But when I wasn't home, it was parking lots that became an asphalt covered oasis. I found very early on that red lights didn't work well because people look around when they're stopped waiting for the light to turn green. They'll catch you with mascara tears and while they won't say anything, there's that awkward moment where you lock eyes and you know they're secretly wondering what's wrong with you. And then there's that feeling you have after a tragedy where you don't care what somebody thinks of you but at the same time, you don't really want to have to explain anything."

That's why parking lots became her safe haven to cry it all out. While they were often packed with shoppers, Diana noticed that people were generally too self-occupied with the mission they were on to pay much attention to the mascara bleeding down her cheeks.

But as grief often goes, she couldn't always perfectly time when or where the blues would hit her.

One day, as she was about to place her order in the Dutch Brothers coffee drive-thru, the wave of sadness hit her like a tidal wave in the middle of her conversation with a friend.

"I could barely catch my breath and the ugly crying started," said Diana. "The problem was, I was stuck in the coffee line. At Dutch Brothers. The one place where all the workers are young, happy and jamming out to music. And there was no way out. I was literally blocked in, so unless I wanted to back right up into the SUV behind me, I was about to be seen for the mess I really was."

In a split-second decision, she decided to face the barista in her broken state and place her order. But what Diana did NOT expect was the beautiful surprise she received at the window:

"She took one look at me and saw how disheveled I was and said nothing. She just handed me my drink. A drink I didn't order because I couldn't even muster the words, but a drink she would know I wanted.

I tried to smile when I took it from her and drove away and finished my call. By this time, I had pulled into a parking stall and was trying to regain my composure. I reached for my iced coffee, and when I looked down in the cup holder, I saw it.

A pink straw, and the words 'We love you' written around it."

The unbelievably sweet and simple act of kindness at a time when she needed it most left Diana "ugly crying again." But this time, for a different reason.

"This girl barely knew me," she shared. "I don't even think at the time she knew my story. All she knew was that at that moment, I was hurting. She couldn't fix it. We couldn't talk about it. She couldn't hug me. So she used the only tool she had in that instance — a pen, and a pink straw.

She wanted me to know I wasn't alone. And that whatever trial I was going through, that there were people out there who cared about me. That regardless of knowing all the details, they cared anyway."

That strikingly simple act left a profound impact on Diana's heart.

That moment taught her that even the tiniest act of kindness can change someone's life for the better. And she wanted to be a part of the movement.

"I take that lesson with me wherever I go and I retell that story to anybody who will listen," said Diana. "Because I want them —no, I need them—to know how powerful their actions can be to a person in pain."

Now she visits a different Dutch Brothers, but nonetheless, the legacy of the 'pink-straw girl' moves on:

"I don't know what she's doing now, but to me, she left a legacy. A legacy of kindness."

Now, every time Diana visits a new stand, she asks for a pink straw just as a reminder that no matter what she's facing, "there's always somebody out there who cares."

And that's not the end of the "pink straw" movement that evolved into something even more beautiful.

Ryan recently shared an extremely encouraging update, reporting on Crystal and Tom's major progress over the last several months.



"Looking at the latest photos of Tom and Crystal brings me back," Ryan added in a separate post. "So amazed at the challenges they have overcome to get where they are. Thank you to everyone who has helped! We could never have done this alone."

Stories of People Helping the Homeless that went Viral

Over Half a Million People were experiencing homelessness in the US in 2017, according to a report from the US Department of Housing and Urban Development. That's 12% more people than the previous year. There are organization such as shelters and soup kitchens to help homeless individuals get back on their feet, But sometimes a human connection sparks a viral moment that can change someone's life. Here are 9 heartwarming stories of people who helped someone in need--and the chain reactions that their acts of kindness created. Tony Carlson, a police officer with the Tallahassee Police Department,

Pulled into a gas station and noticed a homeless man struggling with an electric razor, trying to shave for a job interview at McDonald's. Carlson tightened a screw on the razor and helped the man, named Phil, shave his beard. A patron at the gas station noticed their interaction and posted a video online, which was then shared by the Police Department's Official Facebook page. Senator Marco Rubio's office then helped Phil acquire the necessary paperwork to complete his job application and get hired at McDonald's according to CBS News.

Lauren Puryear uses her extreme Couponing Skills to feed thousands of people. Lauren Puryear, a Mental Health Clinician, set a goal of providing 30,000 meals to the people in need by her 30th birthday. She founded an organization called For the Love of Others and uses her extreme couponing skills for charity. "There are coupons in the Sunday paper, or online that you can print... so I collect as many as I can, match them to the store, and that is how I am able to get the items for free," she told NJ.com.

A woman donated all the food from her canceled \$30,000 wedding to the homeless. Sarah Cummings of Carmel, Indiana, calling off her wedding and couldn't refund what she'd spent to feed and entertain 170 guests. So she invited the residents of a local homeless shelter to partake in the bourbon-glazed meatballs, goat cheese and garlic bruschetta, chicken breast with artichokes, and wedding cake while wearing formal attire donated by local businesses and residents. "I will at least have some kind of happy memory to pull from," she told The Indy Star.

A Bay Area homeless Man was offered a Job after a photo of Him went viral on Facebook. Mat Cordoza literally gave the shirt off his back to Rocky Been, a homeless man he met at Clearwater Beach. He then posted a photo of Been, writing that "I'm not sharing this post for attention or likes but to show how happy

some thing as small as a sweater to keep warm can make somebody feel like gold," according to Fox 15 News

The one small act garnered a wide-ranging response of people who wanted to help. Crabby's Bar and Grill in Clearwater Beach offered him a job, and a GOFundMe campaign raised enough money to provide him with temporary shelter. "I am so amazed how people want to show their love and want to help me. I just can't get over it," Been told Fox 15.

A man turned his truck into a Rolling Shower Mobile for the Homeless. A mobile Shower. Shower to the People from YouTube... Pastor Jake Austin created Shower to the People to give people who are experiencing homelessness access to a hot shower. His truck contains a mobile shower that hooks up to fire hydrants in the St. Louis area. Shower to the People also provides jobs making soap. "Good hygiene promotes health, fosters hope, and restores dignity to those who may have lost it," Austin said in a video on the Organization's YouTube Channel.

Celebrity Barber Jason Schneidman Gives FREE Haircuts to the Homeless. Schneidman gives a man a haircut. ~INSIDER When Jason Schneidman isn't styling Bruno Mars or Hugh Jackman's hair, he's giving free haircuts to people experiencing homelessness in Los Angeles. "What I fund in helping homeless people with haircuts in their appearance changes, and their attitude changes, and then also the people around them see these people differently," he proviously told INSIDER. A Videographer made a Viral Video Showing How to Use Amazon Prime Now to Deliver Necessities to People Experiencing Homeless. Rob Bliss showed people how to use Amazon Prime Now's instant Delivery to help the homeless. ~Rob Bliss on his YouTube~ Rob Bliss took advantage of Amazon Prime Now's instant delivery feature to help people with no address of their

"I had been thinking about how popular apps could be repurposed from their original uses, and it came to me that apps that deliver within one to 2 hours could likely make deliveries to people in need, too," Bliss told TO-DAY. In a video posted to YouTube, which Bliss writes is not affiliated with Amazon in any way, Bliss asks various homeless people if they need anything and orders their requests from them on Amazon Prime Now. In the online order form, he writes instructions for delivering the package-- the name of the person and where they're sitting outside a particular address. Amazon couriers then deliver the necessary items just hours later. The video has over 2 Million views.



McClure began visiting Bobbitt regularly, providing him with a jacket, gloves, a hat, warm socks, food, ad water, as well as extra cash to return the favor. She also set up a GoFundMe Page called "Paying it Forward" with a goal of \$10,000. The page has since raised over \$400,000 --but Bobbitt says he only received \$75,000 and accused McClure and her boyfriend of using the rest as a "personal piggy bank." He is still homeless.

Not only was his spirit broken, but at 57 years old, Pops' body was literally broken. Living in constant pain, Pops told Katy he has seven broken bones that he hasn't been able to afford to get treated.

"He said, 'I have a broken collarbone, I have broken ribs, I've been beaten up,'" Katy told FOX 43. "He needed somebody to step in and help him. That's what I did."

Katy posted that heart wrenching photo of Pops to Facebook, and asked the virtual world for some help.

13 She brought Pops back to her place for the day, and

launched a YouCaring fundraiser in hopes of showing her new friend "that this world is still full of good people."

Support came pouring in from the community with donations of money, clothing and other basic items to help get Pops back on his feet.

He was able to have a nice bath, a warm and safe bed to sleep in, and he received a haircut from Katy's friend, Pamela Denson.


"He was very nice and a soft-spoken gentleman," she said. "He said all he did was pray. The only way he knew how to ask for help was to pray."


In just 11 days, more than 350 people have helped raise more than \$11,000 for Pops.





So let's see what happens to that \$30. The manager keeps \$25, the bellboy gets \$2 and the guys get \$3 back. That adds up fine.

Now let's look at the second way. How much money did they end up paying? Well \$27 dollars, and \$25 of it went to the owner and \$2 to the bellboy. Now, that adds up too.

The problem with the question is that the \$2 that the bellboy gets are contained in the \$27 that they end up paying so we shouldn't expect them to add to anything meaningful.




