# The First of August and how it came to be Switzerland's National Day



# What exactly is being celebrated?

The date is inspired by the date of the Federal Charter of 1291, Pacte du Rütli, placed in "early August", when "three Alpine cantons swore the oath of confederation" (Schwyz, Uri and Unterwald), an action which later came to be regarded as the founding of Switzerland." The document is one of several dozen pacts attested for the territory of Switzerland in the period of the mid-13th to mid-14th century. The foundation of the Old Swiss Confederacy had been mostly associated with the Bund of Brunnen of 1315, or with the Rütlischwur, dated to 1307 by Aegidius Tschudi.

The Federal Charter of 1291 first assumed great importance in a report by the Federal Department of Home Affairs of 21 November 1889, suggest-

ing a celebration in Bern in 1891 that would combine the city's 700th anniversary with the Confederacy's 600th anniversary.

The date of the Federal Charter came to replace the formerly more prominent, traditional date of 8 November Rütlischwur, 1307 in popular consciousness in the 20th century, specifically after the 650th anniversary celebrations of 1941.

It has been an official holiday since 1994, following the acceptance of a federal popular initiative in its favour in 1993.

1 August is celebrated each year with paper lantern parades, bonfires, hanging strings of Swiss flags, fireworks and competitive rifle shooting matches.

# **Town-specific celebrations**

The day of independence is typically

celebrated at a local municipality level, though certain events draw nationwide attention. Since the mid-19th century, Schaffhausen has illuminated the nearby 25-meter-high Rhine Falls for special events. Beginning in 1920, the waterfall has been regularly lit for the national holiday and since 1966 is now lit only for this holiday. At the historic location of Rütli Meadow above Lake Lucerne, a representational celebration is staged in the location where the legendary pledge of alliance, the Rütlischwur is said to have taken place. In Basel there are fireworks at the Rhine on the evening of 31 July.

### Who celebrates the occasion?

August 1 is a statutory holiday and a work-free day, thus enabling everyone to celebrate as and how they wish.

# **Customs and Traditions**

On Swiss National Day, many people decorate their houses with Swiss flags, and numerous public buildings and streets are also adorned with bunting.

Official festivities have been held every year on the Rütli meadow – where, according to legend, the pledge of allegiance was pronounced and the Swiss Confederation was founded – since 1942. The official address is held by the Swiss President and is broadcast on the TV and radio.

In many municipalities, special brunches or evening festivities take place, often together with a fireworks display, which is held as soon as it gets dark. In numerous mountainous regions of Switzerland, private persons or societies set fire to huge bonfires in elevated locations, which can be seen from a long distance

away.

At 8.00pm, all the church bells in Switzerland ring out for a quarter of an hour.

# **How does Zurich celebrate the First of August?**

There are celebrations in communities all around Switzerland. In most cases, the official ceremonies include a prayer and the singing of the Swiss national anthem (the Schweizerpsalm). At 8:00 p.m. (20:00) church bells ring throughout the country.

#### **Public Life**

The Bundesfeier is a public holiday in all of Switzerland. Offices, banks, schools and businesses are closed. Public transport runs on a reduced schedule.

# Guy Dressed as Batman Has Rescued Dozens of Shelter Pets From Euthanasia



Not all heroes wear capes, but this guy has already saved dozens of dogs and cats from euthanasia – and he has done it all while dressed as Batman.

27-year-old Chris Van Dorn has always been a fan of the beloved Caped Crusader; so when he began volunteering for various animal rescue organizations around Orlando, Florida, he decided to combine his two passions and use a Batman suit to bring attention to the importance of pet adoption.

"It kind of just came as a way to embody all the good I wanted to do in the world," Van Dorn told The Dodo, "and make it easy for people to talk to me right off the bat."



Not only has he used the suit as a conversation starter for why people should adopt shelter pets, he has also donned the suit to transport dozens of animals from the shelter to their loving forever homes.

Initially, Van Dorn used the superhero costume as a means of keeping all of his rescue missions anonymous – but his good deeds finally brought his real identity into the limelight after he was featured as an honorary GoFundMe Hero in May.

Since Van Dorn launched his nonprofit Batman4Paws

in 2018, he has embarked on dozens of hours-long cross-country road trips to rescue dogs from euthanasia and bring them to loving families that are willing to adopt them.

Thankfully, the GoFundMe article helped to finance Van Dorn's rescue missions since his crowdfunding page has collectively raised about \$32,000 over the course of the last 10 months.



"When I was first starting out, I was keeping everything really anonymous," Van Dorn told the news outlet. "I would sign everything 'Bruce Wayne' and not put my real name out there ... My catchphrase is, 'It's not who I am underneath but what I do that defines me' and I still hold that true today."

Van Dorn now hopes that he will be able to find a compassionate citizen to donate a bigger van so he can replace his current Batmobile – a humble Honda Accord – and transport more animals on his rescue missions.

He also aims to use his pilot's license as a means of using air travel as a more efficient means of transporting his doggos in distress.

Additionally, since he recently got his trusty sidekick Mr. Boots licensed as a therapy dog, the two have been making plenty of guest appearances as Batman and Robin at various hospitals around Florida.

The Dynamic Duo has also donned their costumes for adoption events and animal shelter fundraisers.

Van Dorn says that the costume helps to draw in more visitors, and he takes every opportunity to hand out brochures and stickers concerning the importance of adoption.



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# German 12-Year-old Boy Plants 1Million Trees, Takes Over UN Program to Plant a Trillion More



The world is a lot greener thanks to this 20-year-old and his army of "climate ambassadors" who have pledged to plant trees and use youth power to avert climate change.

Ever since he was 9 years old, Felix Finkbeiner has been an international figurehead for saving the planet. In 2007, the German youngster founded a global youth movement called "Plant for the Planet" – an initiative that trains and recruits kids from around the world to plant trees as a means of combatting climate change.

Since its creation, the movement has already made significant progress with the help of over 100,000 enthusiastic youth between the ages of 9 and 12—and he planted his one-millionth tree in Germany when he was just twelve. Alongside the Paris Agreement, Finkbeiner's campaign is a formidable defense of the planet.

His speeches as a pre-teen to the European Parliament and the United Nations General Assembly inspired kids from over 90 countries to join his coalition, saying "Forests are not only the livelihood of billions, but for us children forests are our future."

The UN then handed over to Felix the leadership of its Billion Tree Program, which was inspired by the Kenyan Nobel Peace Prize-winning activist Wangari Maathai, whose Green Belt Movement planted 30 million trees in Africa. He is enlarging the program, transforming it into a Trillion Tree Campaign: an audacious international grassroots effort to do exactly that – plant one trillion trees in the next 30 years.

LOOK: Remember the Young Man With a Plan to Rid Oceans of Plastic? His Massive Project to Launch This Summer trillion trees alive in the world today – so planting a trillion more would be an incredible increase. That's roughly 150 trees for every person on Earth, according to National Geographic.

"Children could plant 1 million trees in every country on earth and offset CO2 emissions all on their own, while adults are still talking about doing it," said Finkbeiner. His motto, "Stop talking, start planting," suggests the same sentiment.

The campaign is working in collaboration with organizations such as the World Wildlife Fund and the Wildlife Conservation Society to meet the ambitious goal. The Campeche province of Mexico is already a staging ground for Finkbeiner's no-nonsense motto. Plant for the Planet recently bought 33,300 acres (13,500 hectares) in the area and they plan to plant 10 million trees by 2020.

Other countries' have their own plans for reforestation too. One province in Pakistan has planted 1 billion trees; China is creating forests as big as Ireland; a group of African countries (Ethiopia, Niger, Mali, etc.) are reforesting degraded land; India recently smashed the world record for planting the most amount of trees in a day; and Latin American nations are signing on to reforestation efforts in the Amazon, as well.

All of these combined initiatives offer great hope for the planet, but organizations aside, Finkbeiner is a textbook example of what we can all do on an individual level to save the planet if we just stop talking and start planting.

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# Heroic 20-Year-Old Rushed Back Into Fire To Save Niece

A 20-year-old man in Aberdeen, Washington, is being hailed a hero for rushing into a burning home to rescue his niece and two nephews.

Derrick Byrd is suffering from 2nd and 3rd degree burns on his face, back and arms but he says he "would do it again."



"I'd rather get burnt than her. She's young. She's still got a lot of stuff going for her. She's a good kid," Byrd said about his niece.

When the fire broke, Byrd jumped into action helping the childrens' mother, Kayla, his sister, get the kids out of the second-floor window.

"I ran downstairs even though I got burnt," he told KO-MO News. "Started catching the kids. I caught Junior and I caught Baby Rory out of Kayla's window."

But 8-year-old Mercedes was afraid to jump and when her mom fell off the roof, Mercedes fell back into the burning room.

"She was screaming my name," said Byrd. "So I wasn't just going to let her sit there. I wasn't going to let my niece die."

"And I just ran up the stairs and pushed through the fire," he said. "I could feel it burning me. I got her and took my shirt off and put it around her face so she wouldn't breath in any smoke and I just carried her out as fast as I could."

Byrd and all three children are being treated at the hospital for burns.

"I would do it again," Byrd said from his hospital bed.
"I really would. I don't care. I really would. I'd run
back in there and do it again even
if I got burnt worse or died."

The family's home appears to be a complete loss, with firefighters and police officers expressing

their relief at the fact nobody was killed -- thanks to Byrd's heroic actions.

# **South Carolina Deputy** Saves Baby's Life During **Traffic Stop**

A South Carolina deputy pulled over a car for speeding.

That traffic stop saved a 12-day-old baby's life.

Deputy W. Kimbro with the Berkeley County Sheriff's Office was conducting routine patrol in the Summerville area of **Berkeley County** when he stopped a vehicle for speeding.



Upon stopping the vehicle, the driver immediately exited the car and exclaimed that the baby in her vehicle had stopped breathing.

Kimbro knew he needed to act fast to save the baby's life.

In the body cam footage released Thursday, the deputy can be seen feeling for a pulse before beginning to massage little Riley's chest.

"Come on baby, cry for me, cry for me," Kimbro can be heard saying.

Moments later, the baby starts crying.

"As long as she's crying like that she's breathing," he said in the video.

Kimbro was able to get the baby to breathe again until EMS could arrive and take over.

The child was taken to a local hospital for observation and released.

"Because of Deputy Kimbro's steadfast, professional and heroic response, the 12-day old baby was able to live," the sheriff's office wrote on Facebook. "Please join us in congratulating Deputy Kimbro for his gallant actions that prolonged human life. He was awarded the "Life-Saving Medal" from Sheriff Lewis for his heroic actions that day. Well done!"

# Environmentalists Have Removed 40 Tons Of Trash From The Great Pacific Garbage Patch

The nonprofit organization Ocean Voyages Institute has successfully removed more than 40 tons of fishing nets and plastics from the area known as the North Pacific Subtropical Convergence Zone, or more commonly known as the Great Pacific Garbage Patch.



The latest annual clean-up voyage by the sailing cargo ship, S/V KWAI, completed a 25-day clean up mission in the Pacific, between California and Hawaii. In this region, four ocean currents converge to create a vortex that collects huge amounts of plastics.

The ship returned to Honolulu filled with detergent bottles, beer and soft drink crates, bleach and cleaning bottles, plastic furniture, packaging straps, buckets, children's toys, and myriad types of plastic floating midocean.

"Satellite technology played a key role in our recovery effort, offering an innovative solution to finding areas of dense plastic pollution," said Mary Crowley, Founder and Executive Director of OV Institute. "The nets and other debris are signs of the proliferating plastic pollution that poses threats to marine life, coastal environments, shipping, fisheries, wildlife and our health."

OVI has mounted nine previous clean-up voyages to the area but says its latest haul was the largest and most successful to date. "It is very disturbing to be sailing through what was only decades ago a pristine ocean wilderness and find it filled with our all-too-familiar garbage," says Crowley.

"Urgent action is needed at all levels: curtailing the manufacture of throwaway plastics, preventing plastic trash from entering the oceans, and enlisting the public, corporations, and the maritime industry in education, prevention, innovation and massive cleanup efforts. The question is, are we ready to make it a priority to protect 72 percent of the planet?"

The land was once a dairy farm, home to a young couple, Mr. and Mrs. Kuroki, after they married in 1956. Rising early every morning, the two tended to a herd of 60 cows while raising two children in the process. It was a tough yet rewarding life on the farm, with the hope that one day, upon retirement, they would be able to take a well- earned trip around Japan.



After 30 years of marriage, Mrs. Kuroki suddenly encountered a problem with her eyes, which turned out to be a complication from diabetes causing her sight to fail just one week later.

As a result, she shut herself away from the world and

One day, Mr Kuroki glanced upon a pink shibazakura flower in the garden and it occurred to him that the beauty of flowers can be experienced not only through sight, but through the sense of smell as well. If he were to create a garden filled with flowers, he thought, his wife could still enjoy their beauty, and people might also come to visit, which would bring a smile to her face again.



Mr. Kuroki spent two years planting the sea of bright pink flowers that would eventually surround their home.



Now, more than a decade after the first seeds were planted, the garden draws visitors from surrounding towns and prefectures, with people hoping for a chance encounter with Mr. and Mrs. Kuroki, who can often be seen walking around the property.


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# **Kindness Observed**

# 'I'm the Father I Wish I Had Growing Up': Man Who Grew Up In Foster Care Adopts 3 Boys



Barry Farmer is now a father to three boys, due largely to his own experience growing up in foster care, which steered him towards adoption.

Farmer grew up in Kinship Care, a form of foster care in which a relative steps in to care for a child if their parents aren't able to.

While living with his grandmother as his legal guardian, Farmer says he learned how to be responsible for himself, and as she got older, he learned how to care for her when she needed help.

But when he turned 21, he had an idea: he applied for a foster license to take children in, too.

"Becoming a foster parent was like a tribute to my grandmother because I could never pay her back, but I was definitely able to pay it forward," Farmer, 30, of Richmond, Virginia, told People.

After he got his foster license, he was placed with then -eight-year-old Jaxon, with the plan originally being for him to reunite with his biological family.

But after a year, Jaxon wanted to stay with Farmer.

"It was touching that this child of a different race felt comfortable enough to call me Dad; he was a child searching for belonging in a not so typical situation," Farmer said.

Two years later, in 2013, Farmer adopted Xavier, giving Jaxon a little brother. Then, in 2014, he adopted Jeremiah, who was four at the time and in the foster care system.

"Fatherhood has been everything I imagine it to be because I'm the father I wish I had growing up. I'm involved, I'm there when my boys go to sleep and when they wake up," Farmer said. "I'm their biggest cheer-

leader when helping them achieve their goals. I try not to miss a beat in their lives. I take the responsibility of being their father very seriously and never for granted."

Since adopting them, the three boys are growing out their hair along with Farmer. They plan to donate their hair to cancer organizations when it's long enough.

# Businessman Is Donating 10,000 Bikes To Kids Who Walk Miles To School

A businessman in Myanmar has bought 10,000 bikes from bike-sharing companies and is donating them to underprivileged children across the country who walk miles to school.



EntreMike Than Tun Win, founder of Flymya.com and chief executive of BOD Tech Co, created a non-profit organization called LessWalk which is buying up the bikes and making them suitable for students.

"It's a common sight to see lines and lines of students walking long distances from home to school in rural villages," Than told Tech Crunch. "Some students can walk up to one hour from home to school and the families can hardly afford a simple form of transport like bicycle or motorcycle... a school bus is almost unheard of to the students in rural villages."

Than was able to purchase the bikes at \$40 per bike, costing a total of \$400,000. Half of the money for the project has been funded through donations to Less-Walk. Than himself provided the rest.

"Suddenly, there was an opportunity to buy [these bikes] at fraction of price. The benefit it can develop is well beyond that cost," he said.

In a country with more than nine million students, Than plans to work with government organizations to identify potential beneficiaries. The primary focus is students aged 13-16 who walk over a mile to school each day.

"I'm only halfway through the journey. The remaining 50 percent is making sure we have an impact," Than said.

# Man Drives 1,200 Miles To Rescue Family Stranded In Australian Outback

A good Samaritan embarked on a 1,200 mile roundtrip to rescue a family whose car had broken down in the middle of Northern Territory, Australia.



Daryn Melrose, his wife and two daughters were driving from Gippsland to compete in the national minnow sailing championships when their car broke down in Tennant Creek.

The family was stranded on the side of the road along with their trailer containing two small boats.

Rodney Sims, who lives about 600 miles from where the family had broken down, was on his day off and scrolling through Facebook when he saw a post by ABC Darwin about the stranded family.

"About 30 years ago, strangely enough, I was in a similar situation with a broken-down car and someone helped me out ... this was my time to give back," Sims told ABC News.



Sims left his home late Friday night, met up with the family in Tennant Creek, and had them in Darwin on Saturday in time for the race.

"He drove all the way down to us, hooked up the trailer, and drove us all the way back to Darwin," Melrose said.

"My daughters and I could not be more grateful for his efforts. They got here on time and are hoping for podium finishes after their competitions.

Territory folk are incredibly special."

While the family arrived in time for the competition, their car was left behind.

"Hopefully the car will arrive in Darwin some time today and get taken to a mechanic," Melrose said. "It was more important to get the girls and the boats up here in time for their race. The car will have to wait."

# Grandma Missing 5 Days Is Found Alive After Grandson Decides To Search One Last Time

A grandmother who had been missing for five days was found alive in the woods behind her apartment complex in Charlotte, NC.



Sandra Adams, 69, was reported missing after family members went to check on her at her apartment Friday morning.

They said Adams was last seen Wednesday and was known to walk around her complex but always returned home.

After days of searching, Adams' grandson, Nate Cassel, and his friend, Shawn Willis, decided to search one last time.

"He wanted to go look in the woods. I woke up this morning with the same idea: Let's go search the woods in the neighborhood," Willis told WSOC.

On Monday morning, Cassel and three of his friends fought their way through the heat and heavy brush along the small creek behind Adam's place.

They searched for about a quarter mile until they found her near the park, lying face down in the creekbed.

For a few heartbreaking moments, Cassel thought he had lost her and called the police.

"We got a call about finding a possible deceased person in the creekbed," said CMPD Officer Brian Nicholson.

When Nicholson got to the park, he said Willis showed him where they found the body, but then something remarkable happened.

As we were coming toward her, she raised her arm up," Nicholson said.

Everyone was in shock.

"It's a blessing. It's a blessing, a big blessing, a miracle," Cassel said.

Police told WSOC that Adams gathered enough strength to tell them she fell while going on a walk.
