Monday, January 18, 2021, is Martin Luther King Jr. Day in the United States. Here is why we celebrate this day—plus, information about this influential American, civil rights leader, and Nobel Peace Prize laureate.

REMEMBERING MARTIN LUTHER KING JR.

Reverend Martin Luther King Jr. was born on January 15, 1929. He was a Baptist minister and leader of the civil rights movement, championing justice and equality from the mid-1950s until his death by assassination in 1968. As he said, "Injustice anywhere is a threat to justice everywhere." Dr. King was also a strong advocate of change through nonviolent civil actions based on his Christian values. He was a great speaker, and his powerful words still resonate with us today.

"Our lives begin to end the day we become silent about things that matter."

–Martin Luther King Jr. (1929–68)

WHEN IS MARTIN LUTHER KING JR. DAY?

The third Monday in January is Martin Luther King Jr. Day (often abbreviated to "MLK Day"). It has been a federal holiday since 1986. This means that it is an observed holiday for federal employees, as well as for many schools and businesses. This also means that the holiday does not always fall on Martin Luther King Jr.'s true birth date, January 15.

WHO WAS MARTIN LUTHER KING JR.?


Martin Luther King Jr. was born in 1929 in Georgia into a Christian family. His grandfather was a church pastor, his father became a pastor, and then he became a pastor.

"We may have all come on different ships, but we're in the same boat now."

Graduating from high school at the age of 15, Martin Luther King went on to receive his B. A. degree in 1948 from Morehouse College. After 3 years of theological study at Crozer Theological Seminary in Pennsylvania, he was elected president of a predominantly white senior class and awarded the B.D. in 1951. After winning a fellowship at Crozer, he enrolled in graduate studies at Boston University, completing his residence for the doctorate in 1953 and receiving the degree in 1955. In Boston he met and married Coretta Scott, and they started a family.

In 1954, Martin Luther King Jr. had become pastor of a church in Montgomery, Alabama. Always a strong worker for civil rights, King believed in nonviolence, following Gandhi's philosophy.





The Fight Against Segregation

In 1955, he began his struggle to persuade the U.S. government to declare the policy of racial discrimination unlawful. He led the first large nonviolent demonstration against segregated buses. However, racists responded with violence to his nonviolent initiative.

"Peace is not merely a distant goal that we seek, but a means by which we arrive at that goal."

In Birmingham, Alabama, in the spring of 1963, King's campaign to end segregation at lunch counters and in hiring practices drew nationwide attention when the police turned dogs and fire hoses on the demonstrators. King was jailed along with large numbers of his supporters, including hundreds of schoolchildren. His supporters did not, however, include all the black clergy of Birmingham, and he was strongly opposed by some of the white clergy who had issued a statement urging African Americans not to support the demonstrations. From the Birmingham jail, King wrote a letter of great eloquence in which he spelled out his philosophy of nonviolence:

"You may well ask: "Why direct action? Why sit-ins, marches and so forth? Isn't negotiation a better path?" You are quite right in calling for negotiation. Indeed, this is the very purpose of direct action. Nonviolent direct action seeks to create such a crisis and foster such a tension that a community which has constantly refused to negotiate is forced to confront the issue."

In December 1956, the Supreme Court declared bus segregation unconstitutional.

In 1957, King was elected president of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference. He led according to his beliefs from Christianity, with nonviolent influences from Gandhi. He traveled greatly, wrote five books and numerous articles, and led many initiatives to campaign for the proper voter registration of people of color.

"I Have a Dream"

On August 28, 1963, King directed a march of 250,000 demonstrators to Washington, D.C., where he gave his famous "I Have a Dream" speech, delivered on the steps of the Lincoln Memorial.

Martin Luther King Jr.'s dream was that the inhabitants of the United States would be judged by their personal qualities and not by the color of their skin:

"I have a dream that one day this nation will rise up and live out the true meaning of its creed, 'We hold these truths to be self-evident: that all men are created equal."

The following year, President Johnson signed a law prohibiting all racial discrimination.

In 1964, Martin Luther King Jr. was awarded Nobel Peace Prize at the young age of 35 for his peaceful campaign against racism. He turned over the prize money of \$54,123 to support the civil rights movement. Here is his acceptance speech.

"Peace is more precious than diamonds or silver or gold."

-Martin Luther King Jr. (1929–68)

On April 4, 1968, King was assassinated by a racist while speaking in Tennessee in support of the struggling garbage workers of that city. It had been only 4 years earlier that he had received the Nobel Peace Prize for his nonviolent campaign against racism.

HOW WE OBSERVE MLK DAY

Americans are often encouraged to observe this day not simply as a day off from work, but also as a "Day of Service" to others through appropriate civic, community, and service projects.

Think of Martin Luther King Jr. Day as an opportunity to give to others in any way you can—whether it's a community project or simply being kind to others in your community.

Are you or a loved one needing assistance to move out of a nursing home and back into the community?

The Oklahoma Living Choice Project assists Oklahomans who are wanting to transition out of a nursing home and back into a place of their own. Depending on an individual's needs, services may include:

- Assistance with finding a new residence
- Home-delivered meals
- Transportation
- Adult Day Services
- Skilled nursing
- Therapy services
- Personal care
- Medication management
- Counseling
- Dental/Vision Services
- Transitional funds (one-time allotment of up to \$2,400)

The Living Choice Project is designed for individuals who have, lived in a nursing home for at least 90 consecutive days, qualify for Sooner Care, and are willing to play an active role in their plan of care. The program is for persons 19 years and older with disabilities, or long-term illnesses.

To see if you or a loved one may qualify, go to the Oklahoma Health Care Authority's website and fill out the online application or make a referral. You can contact the Living Choice Program by phone 1-888-287-2443 or email, oklahoma.livingchoice@okhca.org. If you need assistance in the facility, the nursing home's social worker should assist in the online application process. 9 FACTS ABOUT MARTIN LUTHER KING JR.

Martin Luther King Jr. Day is celebrated on the third Monday of the month of January each year. Celebrate this revolutionary civil rights leader with 9 quick facts about his life—and his work.

9 FACTS ABOUT MARTIN LUTHER KING JR.

He was born Michael King Jr. on January 15, 1929. His father, a pastor at Atlanta's Ebenezer Baptist Church, traveled to Germany in 1934 and, inspired by Protestant Reformation leader Martin Luther, changed his name as well as that of his 5-year-old son.

King entered college at the age of 15! He skipped grades 9 and 12 before enrolling at Morehouse College, the alma mater of his father and maternal grandfather, in 1944.

Although he was the son, grandson, and great-grandson of Baptist ministers, he was considering becoming a doctor or a lawyer instead. He later decided that the Bible had "many profound truths which one cannot escape" and entered the Crozer Theological Seminary in Pennsylvania, graduating with his PhD at the age of 25.

He got a C in public speaking during his first year at seminary, but by his final year, King was receiving straight As and had become the valedictorian of his class.

When he won the Nobel Peace Prize in 1964, he was the youngest person to do so, at age 35. (Malala Yousafzai now holds the record, winning the 2014 prize at age 17.)

His recording of "Why I Oppose the War in Vietnam" won a Grammy for Best Spoken Word Album for 1971.

He was jailed 29 times, often on such trumped-up charges as driving 30 miles per hour in a 25-mph zone in Alabama in 1956.

In a speech on April 3, 1968, he told the audience: "I've seen the Promised Land. I may not get there with you. But I want you to know tonight, that we, as a people, will get to the Promised Land." He was assassinated the next day.

He is the only person born in the United States whose birthday is a federal holiday. (George Washington was born before the United States came to be.) In 1983, President Ronald Reagan signed a bill that named the third Monday in January as the holiday observance "Martin Luther King Jr.'s Birthday." It took 17 years



College Student Starts Free Online Tutoring Service For Kids In Low-Income Families

A sophomore at the University of Michigan is offering free virtual tutoring to help kids in low income families with their school work.

Alina Bardwell said she wanted to get involved with volunteering over the summer, but because of the pandemic, in-person volunteering was impossible. So, she got the idea of becoming an online tutor. As schools transitioned to online platforms, Alina



realized that now is the time to help students keep up with school, especially for low income families who might not be able to afford typical tutoring rates.

"We all know that lower-income families have been hit harder than anyone by the pandemic. Some have lost their jobs, some have been forced to quit in order to help their kids with school, many are essential workers working long hours and cannot be home to help their kids with school," Alina told Mlive. "We want to give back in the best, safest way we can: by helping their kids perform better in school for free."

Alina drove around Ypsilanti over the summer and hung up posters with her contact info promoting free virtual tutoring.


As the demand for online tutoring grew, Alina asked a friend to help. Soon the two realized they needed more volunteers.

So, she and more than a dozen other UM students created MiTutor, a free online tutoring service.

After posting in a local Facebook group, Alina said the interest in MiTutor has grown significantly. The post had over 40 responses from interested parents.

Alina says the students are doing their best to accommodate the demand, but they hope that as the program grows, more tutors will be available to work with students.



12 Captivating Facts About Corgis That You Should Know



If you're looking for a compact ball of fluff, energy, and sass, then look no further than a Corgi. These ever so slightly ridiculous dogs have been roaming the hills of Wales for thousands of years, and now they're here to grace your screens with their presence!

So what's the deal with Corgis, and why have they become so popular among denizens of the internet? Let's take a closer look at this majestic breed of dog and get to the bottom of it!

#1 / Corgi translates into "Dwarf Dog."

Although some people don't entirely agree. The most commonly held translation is that "cor" translates into "dwarf", and "gi" translates into "dog" in Welsh. Those who disagree



claim that they're actually a "Watch Dog", as "cor" can also mean to watch over or gather.

Either of these translations fits pretty well of course, but I prefer to live in a world where Corgis are dwarf dogs!

#2 / There are actually two different breeds of Corgis.

Before we go any further, we need to make some distinctions between the two Corgi breeds. While they're strikingly different in appearance, they were only rec-



ognized to be different breeds in the 1930s.

Generally, when people talk about Corgis, they're talking about the Pembroke Welsh Corgi. Originating from the region of Pembroke, Wales, this breed is the smaller of the two, with shorter legs and most commonly has a bobtail.

The second breed of Corgi is the Cardigan Welsh Corgi, which originates from the region of Cardigan, Wales.

Cardigans are an all-round more stocky and larger dog. Their legs are slightly longer by proportion, and they tend to weigh more than your average Pembroke Corgi. Their coat can also come in a larger variety of colors.

The Pembroke Corgi's ears are more pointed, while the Cardigan Corgi's ears are more rounded at the tips.

#3 / Cardigan Welsh Corgis have been around for thousands of years!

The Cardigan Corgi is definitely the older of the two breeds, that much we know for sure. When we look deeper than that, though, it gets a little complicated.

Historians have yet to determine the real origins behind the breeds, but there are some pretty solid theories. One theory for the Cardigan Corgi's origin states that their ancestors came across from mainland Europe to Wales on the boats of Celts around the year 1200 BC.

It's said that these dogs were part of the Teckel family of dogs, which includes the modern-day dachshund. If this is true it means that Corgis have been in Wales for more than 3000 years!

#4 / Pembroke Welsh Corgis are a much more recent breed.

While we do know that they have been around since 1107 AD, we're still a little uncertain as to how they made their way to Wales. The best theory behind the Pembroke Corgi's origin is that their ancestors came across the channel along with Flemish weavers.

It's said that this original breed of dog was then interbred with the preexisting Cardigan Corgi breed, which eventually developed into the Pembroke Corgi that we know and love today.


#5 / According to Welsh legends faeries used to ride Corgis into battle.

Local Welsh legends have a very different idea when it comes to the origin of Corgis. It is said that throughout the night faeries and elves would ride these magnificent little dogs into battle, as well as use them to pull their carriages.

One of the distinct markings on a corgis coat adds to this theory. The sides of some corgis have a slightly different color and can form a shape quite similar to a saddle, which fans of the legend claim to have been just that!

#6 / Corgis were once used to herd cattle.

If you take a stroll through the rolling hills of Wales you'll come across a lot of sheep, but few cattle. This wasn't always the case in Wales though, with cattle being a much more popular form of livestock up

Their short stature was a much more vital trait, though, as they were so low to the ground that they were able to avoid the kicks of any disgruntled cows.

#7 / Corgis are incredibly smart dogs.

In fact, they are listed as the 11th smartest breed of dog! Corgis in general appreciate a very active lifestyle, which no doubt goes back to their cattle-herding days.

They're surprisingly clever little dogs, too, which also would have been of great benefit during their working years. Corgis that are kept as house pets have a reputation for acting out, but generally, this is because they're not being mentally stimulated enough! If you have a corgi that's acting out, try and search for some dog puzzles or ways to play with a smart dog.

#8 / Corgis shed a LOT!

If you've ever had the good fortune to pat a Corgi, you may find yourself wondering how a dog so small could possibly shed so much fur. To start with, Corgis aren't what we would call a short-haired dog, so in general, there's just that much more hair.

In addition to this, Corgis have two different coats of hair, so there's even more of it again! Their inner layer of fur helps to insulate them, but this is shed when the weather gets a bit warmer, usually in spring. Their outer layer of hair is much longer and doesn't shed in the same way, although you will still find it all over your house!

#9 / Corgis are very sociable animals.

Corgis just love attention, quite often acting as they could never get enough of it. While a dog's personality generally reflects their owners in a way, Corgis do tend to enjoy cuddles a lot more.

They're also fantastic with kids, and are quite often a recommended breed for families; kids and corgis tend to use up each others' energy – what a win-win! They're not just sociable with people, though.

As long as they have been trained properly in their early years they absolutely love to get out and play with other dogs!

#10 / Queen Elizabeth II has owned over 30 Corgis in her lifetime!

Queen Elizabeth's lifelong passion for Corgis began way back in 1933 when the Queen was still a princess. She had been visiting the estate of a family friend with her sister when she first lay her eyes on this majestic hound – a Pembroke Welsh Corgi.

Shortly after this visit, their father bought the family their own Pembroke Corgi, which they named Dookie. When Elizabeth turned 18 she was gifted with her very own Corgi, who she gave the very appropriate name of Susan.

It could almost be said that through Susan a new Royal Family was born, the House of Susan I. As of 2020, there have been ten generations of Corgis in Queen Elizabeth's household, and they're all descendants of Susan.

#11 / Corgis are very good watchdogs.

Which, really, is a very positive way of saying that they bark – a lot! On a more serious note, though, they are very loyal and protective dogs.

While a corgi might not exactly be the best in terms of preventing an intruder from breaking into your house, they'll definitely wake the entire house up in the process!

#12 / Corgis are surprisingly fast!

If you've ever been lucky enough to experience a Corgi doing zoomies, then you'll surely agree with me! Corgis have been recorded to run as fast as 25 miles per hour (40 km/h), which is much faster than they appear to be able to run.

Their great speed is thanks to their ability to use more of their upper body strength than other breeds of dogs. Despite their dwarfism, Corgis somehow manage to hold a certain air of royalty.

Maybe it's down to the fact that they're an ancient breed, or quite possibly it's simply a mental connection between corgis and the Queen of England. Either way, when Corgis come to rule the world someday, I for one will welcome our new adorable overlords.

For the majority of people, January symbolizes new beginnings and a fresh start. For others, it's just another ordinary month!

Here we have information on the historical origins of the month being introduced into the calendar back in Roman times.

On top of that, we have a little insight to some notable historical events that happened in this month!

Check out the 21 facts about the month of January below.

The name for January comes from the Roman god, Janus, who is always depicted with two heads. He uses one head to look back on the year before, and the other head to look forward into the New Year!

Oddly enough, couples tend to separate or divorce more so in January than any other month of the year.

In Pasadena, California, there has been a Rose Parade held every year since 1890. It has since been broadcasted worldwide and is typically viewed in over 100 countries around the globe.

If you were born in January, your birthstone is a garnet!

In leap years, January always starts on the same day as April and July.

London is famous for their extensive subway system, nicknamed "The Tube." This makes sense, because they're also responsible for opening the first operational underground railway on January 10th, 1863.

Some historical names for January include "Wulfmonath," which came from the Anglo-Saxons be-

cause it was the month hungry wolves would come scavenging. King Charlemagne would call it "Wintermanoth" meaning "winter/cold month."

Originally, the Roman calendar had only 10 months, and it excluded January and February.

King Numa Pompilius, the second king of Rome, is responsible for adding both January and February to the Roman calendar. He did this so calendars would be equivalent to a lunar year. Even so, it only had 30 days.

Finally, Julius Caesar added a 31st day to the month and completed it to the full month of January we practice now!

January was a monumental year for Alaska! As of January 3rd, 1959, Alaska officially became the 49th state of the United States.

Generally, January is the coldest month of the year in the Northern Hemisphere.

The equivalent month of January in terms of temperature in the Southern Hemisphere is July!

Referring back to the Julian and Gregorian calendars, January is the first month of the year, and the first of seven months to be 31 days long.

In the United Kingdom, some people practice "Dry January." This is a movement to encourage people to quit drinking alcohol for the month in order to encourage public health.

January has two zodiac signs – Capricorn, which is until January 19, and Aquarius, which is for the rest of the month.

The dianthus caryophullus is the birth flower of January – more commonly known as the carnation!

One of the most influential events in U.S. happened in January – on January 1st, 1892, Ellis Island opened, allowing for the immigration of over 20 million people!

Squirrel Appreciation Day



Date When Celebrated: Event is always January 21

Squirrel Appreciation Day is an opportunity to enjoy and appreciate your tree climbing, nut gathering neighborhood squirrels. It's held in mid-winter when food sources are scarce for squirrels and other wildlife. Sure, squirrels spent all fall gathering and "squirreling" away food. But, their supplies may not be enough. And, the variety of food is limited. So, give them an extra special treat today to supplement their winter diets.

Not everyone likes squirrels. While they are fun to watch skirting around the yard and trees, they are aggressive at bird feeders. Squirrels tip almost any bird feeder and spill the seeds in search of the particular seeds they want. In the fall, they attack pumpkins on front porches in search of the seeds inside. For gardeners they dig up and steal flower bulbs, and may eat some of the veggies in your garden.

When you think about it, mid winter is the best time to appreciate squirrels. In the winter they provide a little entertainment. During other times of the year, you may look at them as a pest in the flower and vegetable gardens.

According to Christy Hargrove, the founder,

History and Origin of Squirrel Appreciation Day: Christy Hargrove from Asheville, North Carolina started Squirrel Appreciation Day on January 21, 2001. Christy is a wildlife rehabilitator in North Carolina, and is affiliated with the Western North Carolina Nature Center.

Now it is time to talk about how to control squirrels

Squirrel Control Methods

Squirrels are one of a wide assortment of garden pests. These rodents (yes, squirrels are rodents) are extremely persistent. They climb up, through, and over just about every obstacle you make to keep them out. Not only do they pester your gardens, but squirrels are a nuisance at bird feeders and in flowerbeds.

Home owners and home gardeners struggle to control their population, and to keep them away from plants, vegetables, and the flower bulbs you so carefully planted for next spring. They gnaw and chew through just about anything, except metal.

Controlling Squirrels

Here are some tips and ideas that you can try in the war against the squirrel:

1. Trapping: Hav-a-hart traps are an effective way to eliminate squirrels in your yard and garden. After you trap them, you are rid of them for a while. Eventually, new squirrels move into the empty territory vacated by the squirrels you trapped. But ah, how wonderful it is while they are gone!

Important: Before you trap squirrels or any other animals, make sure to check your local laws. Many localities allow you to trap animal pests, but do not allow you to transfer or release an animal into another area. In these cases, the local animal control office must be notified.

Tip: Put walnuts or peanut butter into the traps. Squirrels

2. Pepper Sprays Pepper sprays and other sprays will discourage them. One taste or smell, and they may scurry to your neighbor's garden. Apply sprays on plants and fruit. But use caution on vegetables, as a residual "Pepper" taste can linger. Apply every one to two weeks, and after rain.

Find a Pepper spray recipe

- 3. Fences and screens: These have a limited effectiveness. Squirrels easily climb over a fence. Only if the plant can be completely screened, will you keep squirrels out. In most cases this is impractical, and it is also not aesthetically pleasing. The fencing must also be metal. Squirrels will effortlessly chew through wood and plastic netting.
- 4. Hunting: If you can hunt in your area, this will obviously eliminate them.... if you are a good shot. Check your local laws, for rules and regulations.
- 5. Cats: A natural predator that will help keep them away, only if the cat is a good hunter.

10 Fancy Facts About Poodles



There's a lot you might not know about France's national dog.

1. They're actually from Germany.

Despite their French reputation, poodles hail from Germany, where they were called pudel, which is German for "puddle."

2. They were historically great at their jobs.

What do poodles have to do with puddles? While poodles today have connotations of wealth and luxury, they were bred to work. The athletic dogs are excellent swimmers and were used by hunters to



retrieve ducks and other birds from the water. They even have a "soft mouth," so they can gently pick up wounded or dead game. In France, the dogs were called caniche, or "duck dog."

3. The fancy 'do has a purpose.

Since these dogs were jumping into freezing cold water, they needed protection. Too much wet fur would weigh them down, so hunters would strategically shear their hair. The pattern was



meant to protect vital areas from cold waters.

4. Poodles come in three varieties.

The poodle is the only dog that comes in three sizes: standard, miniature, and toy. These terms only describe the dogs' size, and the American Kennel Club



considers them all the same breed.

5. The Iditarod Dog Sled Race once had a standard poodle team.

In 1988, a musher named John Suter entered the race with an all-poodle sled team. They didn't do so well: Thanks to matted fur and cold paws, many of the dogs had to be dropped off at check-



points. This struggle led to a new rule that dictated only northern breeds like Siberian huskies and Alaskan malamutes are allowed to race. This measure ensures the safety of breeds that aren't cut out for the extreme cold.

6. Poodle fur never stops growing.

Unlike dogs that shed, the poodle will grow fur continuously. As a result, they need regular grooming. If left ungroomed, their fur will become matted and dreadlock-like. On the upside, they're hypoallergenic and generally odorless.



7. This special fur has led to some crossbreeds.

The poodle has been bred with other popular dogs like Labrador retrievers, cocker spaniels, and wheaten terriers to make more hypoallergenic breeds.



8. Elvis loved them.

The King loved dogs and had quite a collection at Graceland. When he was stationed in Germany, he had a poodle named Champagne. He also gave away many poodles to the women he loved: A toy poodle named "Little Bit" went to a girlfriend, and he gave a poodle named "Honey" to his wife Priscilla.

9. They're super smart.

Poodles are one of the smartest breeds, second only to the border collie in rankings of canine intelligence. Their smarts make them extremely easy to



train and a favorite of circuses. In the 1800s, they were often dressed in miniature human clothing and trained to act out elaborate scenes.



Dark Skies Show Us Stars

One of my earliest childhood memories finds me waking from a deep sleep in the middle of the night, during a family road trip. Far from any city lights, I look out the window toward the sky above, and for the first time, I see what seemed to be an infinitude of stars. I'll never know for sure if I was actually dreaming or not, but I still have the distinct recollection of becoming aware of the immensity of the universe in which we exist. I still recall the intense mix of awe, fear, and hope that I felt, unable to look away until the stars faded with the first light of day.

I often think back to that night and the deep connection I felt to the natural world. But in recent years, the memory has also taken on a metaphorical connotation, reminiscent of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s famous words of hope, "Only when it is dark enough can you see the stars." Today it is not uncommon to read or hear or believe that we are living in "dark times"—such is the state of the world, and our need for hope in the face of many challenges: climate change, inequality, isolation, pandemic, to name only a few.

I, too, have spent most of my life thinking of darkness

as a problem demanding more light—in both the literal and the symbolic sense. But perhaps this fear of the dark has been part of our collective problem. For all practical purposes, most of us now live in the perpetual glow of a world that never sleeps. As essayist and poet Mark Tredinnick has said, "Cities are factories for unmaking the night." We are driven by commerce, for which darkness is just another inconvenient obstacle in the path of production and consumption; we rely on the latest technology to offer the facade of a connection to one another. But more light is not what we need; it's more darkness.

Given the myriad ways in which we humans have all but severed our connection to the natural world, perhaps none will prove to be as profound as the loss of the night sky and of our connection to the dark.

The loss of our connection to darkness and to the night sky is emblematic of our deeper separation from the natural world. We need to question our blind acceptance of a world bathed in artificial light; to not fear the night but to reconnect with it, to be awed by it, to know that if we are patient, we will be able to see through the darkness. As I ponder how the technology to which we are now tethered is affecting me and those closest to me; as I wonder how I can guide my own child to embrace the night and understand that without darkness we are not just incomplete ... we fail to

I think back again on the voice of Martin Luther King Jr., the famous dream maker, who saw stars through the darkness.
