March--The Month of Mars



This month, originally the first in the year, is named after Mars, the God of War. He was the son of Jupiter and Juno, the king and queen of the gods, and was generally represented in a shining suit of armour, with a plumed helmet on his head, a spear in one hand, and a shield in the other. His chariot was driven by the Goddess of War, Bellona, who also watched over his safety in battle; for the gods often took part in the battles which were constantly raging on the earth. During the great fight between the gods and the giants to decide who was to rule the world, Mars was captured by two of the giants, who bound him with iron chains and kept watch over him day and night. After over a year of captivity he was freed by the clever god Mercury, who succeeded in loosening the chains so silently that the giants heard no

sound. Mars also took part in the Trojan War, when he was actually wounded.

Mars was loved by Venus, the Goddess of Beauty, but wishing to keep their love a secret from the other gods, they met only during the night, and Mars appointed his servant Alectryon to keep watch and to call him before the sun rose as he did not wish Apollo, the Sun God, to see them. One night Alectryon fell asleep, and so was too late to warn Mars of the sun's approach. Apollo saw them from his chariot as he drove across the sky, and told Vulcan, the God of Fire, who caught them in a net of steel, and thus held them prisoner, while the other gods made fun of them. As soon as he

was set free, Mars, who was filled with anger against Alectryon for failing in his duty, changed him into a cock, and driving him into a farmyard, condemned him to give warning every day of the sun's rising--a fanciful explanation why

"the cock with lively din,
Scatters the rear of darkness thin".
MILTON--L'Allegro.

The gods, though they themselves were immortal--that is, could never die, nor even grow old--yet sometimes married mortal, the men or women whom they found on the earth, and Mars fell in love with a beautiful girl named Ilia, who had given up her life to serve in the temple of Vesta, the Goddess of Fire. It was the duty of these priestesses of Vesta to guard the fire which continually burned on the altar of the goddess, for the safety of the people was thought to depend on this sacred flame. No Vestal, as these priestesses were called, was allowed to marry, under penalty of death. Ilia, however, in spite of her solemn promise, consented to marry Mars, and keeping her marriage a secret, continued to live in the temple. In course of time she had two sons, Romulus and Remus. Her father and mother, hearing that she had broken her vow, ordered the full punishment of her crime to be carried out; the mother was buried alive, and the children were left in the forest to be killed by the wild beasts.

Thus Ilia perished, but the children were wonderfully saved, so the story tells us, by a wolf, who cared for them as if they had been her own young. They were soon after found by a shepherd, who took them to his home, where they grew up to be strong and brave men. As soon as they had reached manhood they left their home and went out into the world to seek their fortune. Coming to a beautiful country of hills and valleys, they decided to build a great city; but before they had even finished the outer walls, they quarrelled about the name which was to be given to it when it was built. Romulus lost his temper and struck his brother Remus, so that he fell dead to the ground. With the help of a band of wicked and cruel men like himself, Romulus at last succeeded in building a city, which, called Rome, after its founder's name, was to become one of the most famous cities the world has ever known.

Romulus became the first king of Rome, but he ruled so harshly that the senators, the chief men of the city, determined to rid themselves of him. During an eclipse of the sun, which darkened the city just at the time when Romulus and the senators were assembled in the marketplace, the senators fell on the king with their swords and slew him. They then cut his body into small pieces, which they hid beneath their cloaks. When the light re-

turned and the people found that their king had disappeared, the senators told them that Romulus had been carried off by the gods to Mount Olympus, and ordered a temple to be built in his honour on one of the seven hills of Rome.

Mars took the city of Rome under his special protection, and is said to have sent a shield from heaven, during a time of plague, as a sign that he would always watch over the city. The Romans, afraid lest the shield should be stolen, had eleven other shields made, so like the first that only the priests who guarded them in the temple of Mars could tell which was the one sent from heaven. These priests were called Salii, the Leapers, because they danced war dances when, during the month of March, the shields were carried in a procession through the streets of Rome.

To Mars, as the God of War, the Romans naturally turned for help in war-time, and a Roman general, before setting out, went into the temple of Mars and, touching the sacred shield with the point of his spear, cried "Mars, watch over us!"

The training-ground of the Roman soldiers was called Campus Martius (the Field of Mars), in honour of the God of War, and it was commonly believed that Mars himself led their army into battle and helped to give them the victory. March was named after Mars because of its rough and boisterous weather, and we find the same idea in the minds of the Angles and Saxons, who called it Hlythmonath--the loud or stormy month. Another name for it was Lenctenmonath, the lengthening month, because it is during March that the days rapidly become longer.


Observations on Aging



Forget health food. I'm at the age where I need all the preservatives I can get. The older we get, the fewer things seem worth waiting in line for.



Duck Hunting on Ice Covered Lake





A Gas Leak Leads Homeowner To A Hibernating Bear Raising 3 Cubs Under The House

Three tiny bear cubs were successfully reunited with their mother under a home in Sevier County, Tennessee.



Last week, the homeowner noticed a gas leak on his property and called the gas company to get the line repaired. When the repair crew arrived and crawled under the house, they spotted a very large snoozing bear and called the Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency.

Wildlife officers arrived on the scene and made a plan to get the bear to move along. The officers did not know there were cubs at the time.

The disturbance caused the mother bear to flee the scene -- and that's when wildlife officers discovered the babies.

Based on their understanding of bears, they believed the mother would never return. So, the cubs were safely extracted and taken to Appalachian Bear Rescue.

While the bears were being cared for, officers moni-

tored the home in case the mother returned. To their surprise, she did.

"On February 16, 2021, we wrote in reference to the three little cubs: 'Reunion with their mother is next to impossible'," ABR wrote on Facebook.

We're happy we didn't say it was flat-out
impossible, though
everything pointed to
it being so. With all
the humans going in
and out of the crawl
space, we were sure
she'd never come
back. But she did.
And we're happy she
did. Learning never
ends."

With the homeowner's approval, wildlife officers returned the cubs through a vent in the home's foundation.

Story time. So if you know me, you know that on the weekend I work for delivery services. This particular weekend I was In Austin delivering groceries, making some extra money as everyone tried to prepare for the Winter Storm. Goal was to do some runs in the morning, head home around noon. Be Home before the snow

hit Sunday night. I intended to sip some wine, and eat some Valentine's Chocolate and wait out this storm. Well things didn't go as planned AT ALL!!

I accepted my last run at around 11 am. Road Conditions were becoming poor so it took me a little over an hour to pick up their order and arrive at their home. Their home sat lower than the main road so their driveway was at an incline. I begun my descent down the hill. Very cautiously. I crept downward remembering to tap my brakes and not slam them in Icy conditions. I tapped, but the car continued at the same speed. Tapped a bit more aggressively yet the speed seemed to accelerate. I panicked and slammed my brakes, but my car continued forward down the driveway. I realized I had lost control of the car. I just braced myself for impact as the car slide towards their home.

I closed my eyes and every imaginable worse case scenario flashed through my head. Then I opened my eyes to see the car roll into their flowerbed, hit their slumped tree and then stop. Luckily I didn't have enough momentum to cause damage. I was safe, car was undamaged, their property was safe... but that tree was a goner!

I unloaded groceries and informed them of the situation. I was able to get my car turned around but the slope was COVERED in ice and my wheels just spun and my car slide back down attempted after attempt. We decided to call a tow truck and not risk damage to

my car or their Home!

AAA said it would be an hour or 2 for a truck to arrive. They agreed to let me wait inside. Hours passed, no tow truck. Repeatedly made calls to AAA with no answers given. Finally around 6pm AAA said my location was "inaccessible due to current conditions".

I tried to get an Uber/Lyft/Taxi just to get me to the hotel a few miles away so I could stay for the night. But obviously if tow trucks weren't getting through, neither were cars. Conditions worsened and options dwindled and eventually the couple offered their guest bed room to me for the night!

These people let a complete STRANGER stay the night! Not only that but cooked me a STEAK DINNER! definitely not how I imagined my Valentine's Day!

Well the saga continues. It is currently DAY FIVE and I am still here! Thanks to some heavy sweeping (TX =no snow shovel) we cleared the driveway and were able to get my car up the incline. So I no longer need a tow. But the road conditions were still horrible! Cars weren't even making it out of the neighborhood safely. Power was going out across the city, stores were closed or empty, hotels overrun by people seeking warmth. Every morning, when I suggested leaving to a hotel.. "could you make it there safely?" "What would you eat?" "What if they lose power" "isn't the guest room better than the Hampton Inn?"

They basically have refused to let me leave.

Every morning after they say -"no worries, stay a bit longer." - I go to "my" room and shed tears of joy. Their home still has water and power so we are clean and warm. They have groceries (I know, I delivered them) so we are fed.

How AMAZINGLY BLESSED am I right in this moment?!

Blessed that HEB curbside delayed their Saturday delivery and pushed it to Sunday

Blessed that I hit "Accept" before the timer ran out.

Blessed that out of all the places for my car to get stuck, that it was in their flowerbed and not a ditch.

Blessed they were willing to let the "Delivery Driver" into their home in the midst of a pandemic.

Blessed that during the time of a food shortage, they were willing to share their meals.

Blessed that they liked my coconut cake! (I baked them a cake to show my gratitude)

Completely BLESSED all the way around!!

God truly #Anchored me during this storm and sent me amazing Guardian Angels.

Looks like one more night here. Tomorrow's weather will be warm and I can make it back home. I can't believe everything that has happened. Beyond grateful that I have been able find comfort with strangers during this unprecedented Winter Storm.

As for Condon and Richardson, they never thought twice about their decision to let Timmons in, and hope that others would have done the same for a stranger in need.

"We would hope that if our daughters were in a situation similar to Chelsea, that there would be someone that would treat them like we treated Chelsea," Condon said. "I don't think we ever thought twice about it."

Timmons safely made it home on Friday, but Condon and Richardson plan to stay in touch with her.

"She just became kind of part of the family pretty quickly," Richardson said.

Are you or a loved one needing assistance to move out of a nursing home and back into the community?

The Oklahoma Living Choice Project assists Oklahomans who are wanting to transition out of a nursing home and back into a place of their own. Depending on an individual's needs, services may include:

- Assistance with finding a new residence
- Home-delivered meals
- Transportation
- Adult Day Services
- Skilled nursing
- Therapy services
- Personal care
- Medication management
- Counseling
- Dental/Vision Services
- Transitional funds (one-time allotment of up to \$2,400)

The Living Choice Project is designed for individuals who have, lived in a nursing home for at least 90 consecutive days, qualify for Sooner Care, and are willing to play an active role in their plan of care. The program is for persons 19 years and older with disabilities, or long-term illnesses.

To see if you or a loved one may qualify, go to the Oklahoma Health Care Authority's website and fill out the online application or make a referral. You can contact the Living Choice Program by phone 1-888-287-2443 or email, oklahoma.livingchoice@okhca.org. If you need assistance in the facility, the nursing home's social worker should assist in the online application process. Fan Theory Suggests The Joker Is Actually The Hero In The Dark Knight

A Reddit user has come up with a fascinating theory that the Joker is the real hero in Christopher Nolan's The Dark Knight.

And while it seems insane to think that, he makes a lot of interesting points.



This is what he wrote:

"I briefly checked the history by doing a few searches and didn't see anything quite like this, but I apologize if someone else has come up with a similar theory before.

Joker, although a lying psychopath, is actually the hero in The Dark Knight. Before the Joker, Gotham was a mess. Entire sections of the city were closed off due to madness, organized crime ran rampant, and the majority of important city officials were wildly corrupt. Dent actually argues FOR insulating the men on the top in the interest of cleaning the streets of lower-level goons, but Joker knows that won't work in the long-term.

At this point we honestly just have 3 men battling for Gotham's "soul" (as Joker puts it), but Dent and Wayne are simply playing into Joker's greater plan. This even extends to Joker's threats to destroy a hospital. With Batman and Gordon's help, Joker helps them root out corrupt police officials. Dent even kills some of those officials later in the film.

Gordon's promotion, too, did a major service to Gotham. I think a lot of people take the Joker's clapping during Gordon's promotion scene to be sarcastic, but I actually think that Joker believed in Gordon, one of the few officers on the force who was truly incorruptible.

So now Joker has a pretty clear path to getting rid of the Organized Crime problem and the corrupt officials problem, but the Vigilante problem remains. As we saw at the beginning of the film, Batman was inspiring other vigilantes, and a society cannot stand when each man takes his own justice. This symbol of fear and unbridled vengeance, as Joker sees it, needs to be stopped, but not Killed. If he were killed, he would just be a martyr, and his symbol would live on. Of course, since Dent was a far better symbol for the city, he would make a far better martyr.

I don't know if Joker actually intended for Harvey to be so physically scarred by the explosion from which Batman saved him, but I am certain that he wanted Harvey to feel the full pain of Rachel's death, which is why he purposely tells Batman to go to the wrong address. He knows what Rachel's death would do to Harvey psychologically, and that Batman would eventually have no choice but to kill Harvey. This breaks Batman psychologically, and also makes him a villain, a true villain, the kind that abandons his own principles. Batman now has no choice but to disappear, leaving his memory to fade into something of urban legend by the time of TDKR.

When we pick up in the next film we see a defeated Bruce Wayne who had retired 8 years prior. The city was safe and peaceful (until Bane shows up), and doesn't need constant vigilante justice to keep it safe. Joker shows Batman the error of his ways, but does so in a totally devastating way.

Even the display with the two boats at the film's climax only served to prove to the people of Gotham that they wouldn't turn on each other. He proved that there was good even in the most supposedly despicable of Gotham's inmates.

In the end Gotham is actually clean. It wasn't because of Harvey, who died too soon to do any good, except as a martyr, and it wasn't because of Batman who was ostracized and treated like the criminal such a vigilante truly is for 8 years. Gotham was safe because the Joker had cleaned up the streets. He eliminated the corrupt police, he destroyed organized crime financially, he uplifted Gotham's spirit, and he even got rid of the flying pest that had been corrupting Gotham ever since he declared himself it's protector."

The author added that "Hero" may have been a poor choice of words and thinks "Savior" might be a better term. But you get the point.
